Information society indicators

- Entire country is covered with a broadband
- 100% of schools and government organizations are ICT equipped
- 99,8 % of bank transfers are performed electronically
- 98% of income tax declarations made via the e-Tax Board
- 97% of businesses use computers
- 95% of medication is bought with e-prescription in 2014
- 66% of the population participated in e-census
- Over 30 % of votes were cast over the internet in 2015

E-Identity

- 2002 introduction of national electronic ID-Card
- More than 94% of the population has one
- Compulsory for all residents
- Certificate for authentication and digital signature
- 20% active users of MobileID

Availability - X-road


Integrity - KSI
